Castle Point Funds – Castle Point Trans-Tasman Fund

This fund update was first made publicly available on 13 February 2019.

What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how Castle Point Trans-Tasman Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Castle Point Fund Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the [Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013](#). This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The Trans-Tasman Fund invests in New Zealand and Australian Listed Companies and is benchmarked to the S&P/NZX 50 Index (incl Imputation Credits). While the Fund is targeted to be fully invested into equities, it will hold a low level of cash for transactional purposes.

The performance objective of the Fund is to outperform the benchmark over rolling three-year periods after all fees (and other expenses) but before tax.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for Castle Point Trans-Tasman Fund



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund’s assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

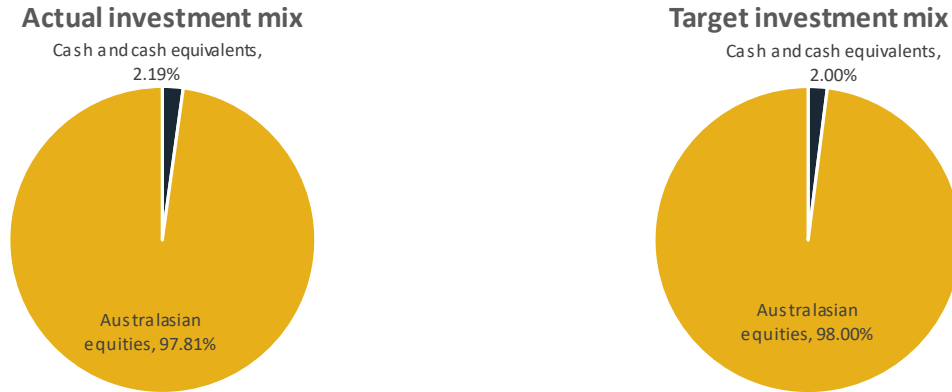
Example of how this applies to an investor

James had \$10,000 in the Fund when the Fund started on 20 November 2018 and did not make any further contributions. At 31 December 2018, James received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$68 (that is 0.68% of his initial \$10,000). This gives James a total return after tax of \$68 for the year.



What does the fund invest in?

This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.



The target hedging level as at 31 December 2018 for Australian assets was 95%. The Fund’s exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 17.70%, of which 96.63% was hedged. This means the Fund’s total unhedged foreign currency exposure was 0.60% of the net asset value of the Fund.
